MILTON TOWN COUNCIL CANDIDATE JOHN MANCINI LAUNCHES INTERACTIVE ONLINE CAMPAIGN

(Ballston Spa, NY) John Mancini, the endorsed Republican, Independence, and Conservative Party candidate for Milton Town Council, today launched an online campaign designed to keep Milton voters informed about his activities on the campaign trail and positions on the issues. This interactive campaign, which features a main website (ManciniForMilton.com) and a Facebook page, will allow voters to provide John with their feedback and discuss the important issues facing the Town of Milton.

“I am excited to launch these two websites, which will allow me to stay close with our town’s voters and keep in touch with them on the news and events taking place on the campaign trail,” Mancini said. “This will be an active, positive campaign about the issues and it’s important for me to get as much feedback as I can from the people who live in our community. These websites will allow me to spread my message of fiscal conservatism, government integrity, and a commonsense approach to embracing the opportunities in our future while ensuring that Milton remains family-friendly and affordable.”

A key component of ManciniForMilton.com is a blog called “On the Campaign Trail,” where John will post regular updates on issues and key campaign activities. The site also includes news updates, the latest photos from the campaign trail, information about John and his candidacy, and a feature that will allow supporters to make secure online campaign contributions.

John Mancini grew up in the Town of Milton, and now he and his wife Courtney are raising their sons Jack and Spencer here. He works as counsel for the New York Conference of Mayors and previously trained municipal officials from around the state on ethics for the New York State Commission on Public Integrity. John is also an active volunteer in the community. He serves on the Ballston Spa Planning Board and was chairman of the Ballston Spa Bicentennial Committee in 2007.
